Figure 1: Students' Feedback on Curriculum, 2017-2018

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







Figure 8: Students' Feedback on Teacher, 2019-2020



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Figure 9: Students' Feedback on Teacher, 2020-2021















Usefulness of study groups in further learning

Timeliness of Practical Work




Educative Value of mid-programme placement


Offering and seeking helpful feedback








In fairness of evaluation the response of 54.17% are very good, 37,50% are good, 8.33% are satisfactory and 0.00% are below threshold.


Interaction with Administration












In recreational facilities the response of 5.56% are very good, 45.83% are good, 47.22% are satisfactory and 1.39% are below threshold.




